04 | **INTRODUCTION**

On Thursday 2 May 2024 there will be elections for the Mayor of London and the 25 Members of the London Assembly. I am required by law to send this booklet to all registered voters who are eligible to vote in these elections. It includes mini-manifestos from the Mayoral candidates who have chosen to have one, and the names of all candidates standing for the London Assembly.

Changes to this year's elections

Photo ID: If you are voting in a polling station, you **must** now bring photo identification. You can find out what forms of ID are acceptable on pages 10-12

How we vote: The way we elect the Mayor of London has changed. There will only be **one** vote for the Mayor, when in the past there has been a first and second choice.

There are two types of London Assembly Member. Constituency Assembly Members represent the 14 London Assembly constituencies, and 11 Assembly Members represent the whole of London. As in previous elections you have **one** vote for each.

You can find out more about how to vote and how we work out the results in this booklet.

Mayor of London candidates

There is a list of the Mayoral candidates on page 5. Each candidate was given the choice to put a mini-manifesto in this booklet. 11 candidates chose to do so and paid £10,000 towards the booklet's cost. This is the amount required by law. The candidates and election agents have full responsibility for the content of their statements, which must comply with legal requirements. The views expressed are theirs alone. The Greater London Returning Officer and the Greater London Authority have no legal powers to edit, amend or fact-check these statements. Lots were drawn to decide the order in which they appear in this booklet.

The London Assembly

The London Assembly acts as the eyes and ears of Londoners. Members hold the Mayor to account by examining Mayoral strategies, decisions and actions to make sure they are in the public interest. The Assembly also conducts investigations into issues of importance to Londoners. You can find out who is standing for election from page 37 of this booklet.

When to expect the results

Saturday 4 May

The counting process will take two days, starting on Friday 3 May. Results will be declared on Saturday 4 May.

06 | WHERE YOU CAN VOTE

At your polling station

You must show photo ID to vote at a polling station. You can find out more on pages 10-12.



Before 2 May, you will be sent a poll card that tells you where your polling station is. You do not need to take the card with you to vote, but it will help staff. You can only vote at the polling station listed.

You can also find your polling station using our online polling station finder. Visit **londonelects.org.uk**.

Applying to vote by post or by proxy

You can also apply to vote by post, or appoint someone you trust to vote on your behalf as your proxy.

By post

You can apply online to vote by post. Go to **gov.uk/apply-postal-vote**.



If you're a registered postal voter, your three ballot papers will be sent to you before polling day. The deadline for new postal vote applications, and for changes to existing postal or proxy votes, is 5pm on 17 April.

You should follow the instructions in the postal ballot pack carefully.

Your ballot papers and postal voting statement must arrive at your borough's electoral registration office by 10pm on 2 May, in the envelopes provided. If you have not posted them in time, you can deliver them by hand on polling day. You can drop them off at any polling station in the borough where you are registered to vote or at your borough's electoral registration office. When doing so you will need to complete a short form, so please allow time for this.


By proxy

If you know that you won't be able to get to the polling station on polling day, you can ask someone you trust to cast your vote on your behalf. This is called a proxy vote and the person casting your vote is often referred to as your proxy. The deadline to apply for a proxy vote is 5pm on 24 April.



The person voting on your behalf can either go to your polling station to cast your vote, or apply to vote on your behalf by post (the deadline is 5pm on 17 April). Find out how to vote by proxy at **gov.uk/apply-proxy-vote**. If you don't have internet access, your borough's electoral registration office can help.

What to expect at the polling station



You will be asked for your name and address, and to present your photo ID. Staff will check the name on your ID matches the name on the electoral register, then give you three ballot papers. They can help you understand how to complete them too.

Photo ID

You can find the accepted forms of ID on pages 10-12 of this booklet. Please note that expired ID documents remain valid if you can still be identified from your photo.

If you do not have an accepted form of ID, or you are concerned you no longer resemble your photo, you can apply for a free voter ID certificate by 5pm on 24 April. Provisions are also in place for people who are registered to vote anonymously.

Additional support

There are 'tactile voting devices' and large-print versions of ballot papers at polling stations to help people with visual impairments.

Polling stations also have accessible booths to accommodate wheelchairs.

Information in other languages

All voting materials in polling stations are in English. Guidance notes will also be available at polling stations in 24 additional languages: Romanian, Spanish, Polish, Bengali, Portuguese, Gujarati, Italian, Panjabi, Arabic, Tamil, Turkish, French, Urdu, Bulgarian, Persian or Farsi, Somali, Greek, Russian, Lithuanian, Albanian, Tagalog/Filipino, Hungarian, Nepalese, Hindi.

WHAT TO EXPECT AT THE POLLING STATION | 07

What does the Mayor of London do?

The Mayor's job is to make London a better place for everyone who visits, lives or works in the city.

This ranges from developing policies to setting budgets, from overseeing major programmes to championing London around the world.

Responsibilities of the post include policing, transport, housing, fire and emergency planning, the environment, culture, economic development, regeneration, planning and development, and tackling health inequalities. The Mayor is elected for a four-year term.

How is the Mayor elected?

At previous London Mayoral elections, it was possible to make a first and second choice for Mayor. This 'second preference vote' was abolished by the government's 2022 Elections Act. Now you only have **ONE** vote for Mayor. Polling station staff can help you if you have any questions.

How do I vote?

Vote for the Mayor using your PINK ballot paper.

- Choose who you want to be Mayor of London. You have one choice.
- Mark [X] next to your choice.

The candidate with the most votes is elected Mayor.



What does the London Assembly do?

The London Assembly has an important role in London's government. It holds the Mayor to account by examining their decisions. It also investigates issues that matter to Londoners.

The London Assembly is made up of 25 Members. 14 Assembly Members are elected to represent London's 14 constituencies. Another 11 Members represent London as a whole. The London Assembly is elected for four years.

How is the London Assembly elected?

For Constituency London Assembly Members, the candidate in each of the 14 constituencies with the most votes wins.

London-wide Assembly Members are elected according to how well the respective parties or independent candidates have done by adding up the votes from across London. Any party or independent candidate with 5% or less of the votes is eliminated. The 11 seats are then allocated to the remaining parties or independent candidates. This is worked out using a formula that takes into account the number of Constituency London Assembly Member seats the party has won; so that the overall make-up of the Assembly proportionally reflects how Londoners have voted.

How do I vote for the London Assembly?

In the election for the London Assembly, you have two ballot papers.

Vote for the Constituency London Assembly Member using the YELLOW ballot paper

- Choose who you want to represent your local area on the London Assembly.
- Vote for only one candidate.
- Mark [X] next to your choice.

Vote for the London-wide Assembly Member using the ORANGE ballot paper

- Choose who you want to represent the whole of London on the London Assembly.
- Vote only once.
- Mark [X] next to your choice.





10 | ACCEPTED FORMS OF PHOTO ID

You can use any of the following forms of photo ID when voting at a polling station.

International travel

 Passport issued by the UK, any of the Channel Islands, the Isle of Man, a British Overseas Territory, a European Economic Area (EEA) state or a Commonwealth country (including an Irish Passport Card)

Driving and parking

- Driving licence issued by the UK, any of the Channel Islands, the Isle of Man, or an EEA state (this includes a provisional driving licence)
- A Blue Badge

Local travel

- Older Person's Bus Pass funded by the UK Government
- Disabled Person's Bus Pass funded by the UK Government
- 60+ London Oyster Photocard funded by Transport for London
- Freedom Pass
- Scottish National Entitlement Card issued for the purpose of concessionary travel (including a 60+, disabled or under 22s bus pass)
- 60 and Over Welsh Concessionary Travel Card
- Disabled Person's Welsh Concessionary Travel Card
- Senior SmartPass issued in Northern Ireland
- Registered Blind SmartPass or Blind Person's SmartPass issued in Northern Ireland
- War Disablement SmartPass issued in Northern Ireland
- 60+ SmartPass issued in Northern Ireland
- Half Fare SmartPass issued in Northern Ireland

Proof of age

• Identity card bearing the Proof of Age Standards Scheme hologram (a PASS card)

Other government issued documents

- Biometric immigration document
- Ministry of Defence Form (Defence Identity Card)
- National identity card issued by an EEA state
- Electoral Identity Card issued in Northern Ireland
- Voter Authority Certificate
- Anonymous Elector's Document

If you don't have an accepted form of photo ID

You can apply for a free voter ID document, if:

- you don't have an accepted form of photo ID
- you're not sure whether your photo ID still looks like you
- you're worried about using an existing form of ID for any other reason, such as the use of a gender marker


Out-of-date photo ID

You can still use your photo ID if it is out of date, as long as it looks like you. The name on your ID should be the same name you used to register to vote.

12 | ACCEPTED FORMS OF PHOTO ID

You will only need to show one form of photo ID, but it needs to be the original version and not a photocopy.

You can use any of the following accepted forms of photo ID to be able to vote at a polling station.

- Mark [X] next to the candidate of your choice. Make ONE CHOICE only.
- In previous elections it was possible to make a second choice for Mayor. This is no longer the case.






